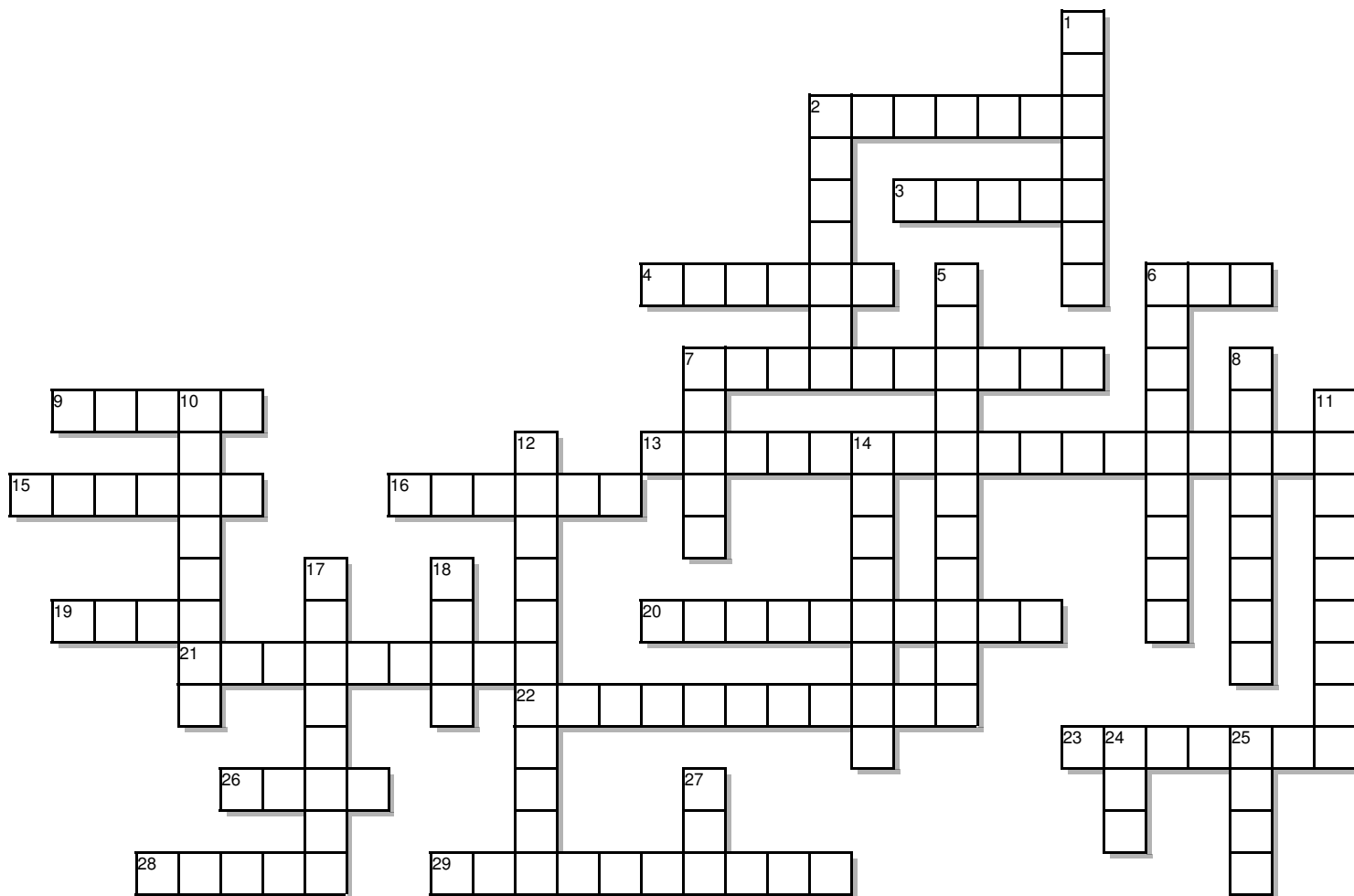


Australian golf in the 1990s

- 7 Three-time winner in the '90s who was once scouted to play AFL for Melbourne.
- 9 Surname, American who was runner-up in 1998 ANZ Players Championship at Royal Queensland.
- 13 Animal mascot of PGA Tour of Australasia 1990-96.
- 15 Leading amateur 1997 Victorian Open.
- 16 Airline partner of the PGA Tour of Australasia in 1992.
- 19 Back-to-back winner of SA Open at Royal Adelaide.
- 20 Host course of 1997 Johnnie Walker Classic.
- 21 Jack Nicklaus-designed course opened in 1997.
- 22 Host course of first two Australian Ladies Masters, won by American Jane Geddes.
- 23 American winner of inaugural Vines Classic in Perth.
- 26 Scored an albatross on the 8th hole, second round of 1996 Coolum Classic, Michael ----.
- 28 Michelle -----, Women's Australian Amateur Champion 1997 & 1998.
- 29 Host course for 1993 and 1994 Canon Challenge.

- 1 Surname, winner of three Australasian Tour events in the '90s who later moved into the kitchen.
- 2 Host course of Australian PGA Championship, 1992-1994
- 5 Queensland course opened in 1992 designed by David Graham and Gary Panks.
- 6 Popular Australian golf equipment brand.
- 7 Surname, American who won twice on PGA Tour of Australasia in 1994.
- 8 Surname, left-handed Australian Open Champion.
- 10 NSW birthplace of 1995 US PGA Champion, Steve Elkington.
- 11 1997 & 1998 Australian Boys' Amateur Champion.
- 12 Most Australian courses had banned golfers from wearing these by the end of the 1990s.
- 14 Mobile phone company, Australian Masters naming rights sponsor.
- 17 Victorian course opened for play 1997, designed by Tony Cashmore.
- 18 Regularly worn on the bottom lip by 1994 Heineken and Coolum Classic winner, Mike Clayton.
- 24 Hometown of eight-time major winner Karrie Webb who turned pro in 1994.
- 25 Surname of brothers Matthew and David, pros on the PGA Tour of Australasia in the '90s.
- 27 Popular Maxfli brand ball manufactured in Sydney and Melbourne.
