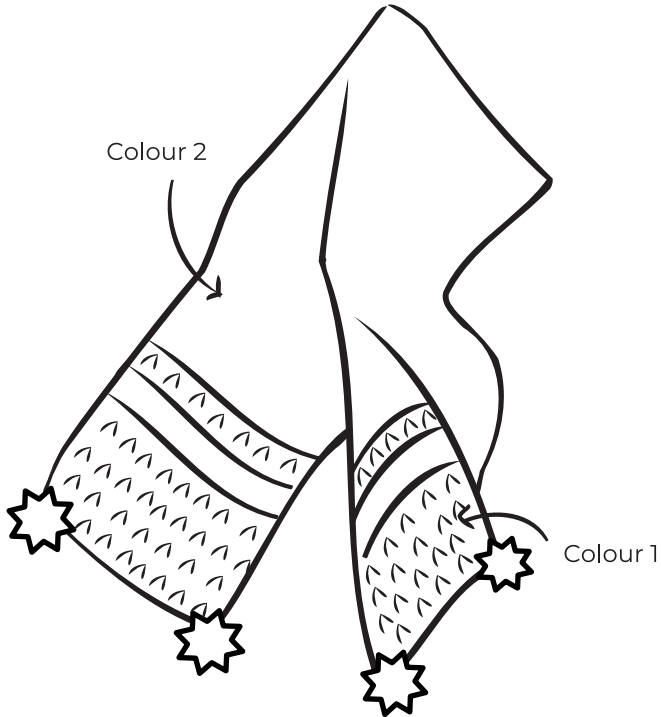


FRANKIE SCARF

Hey superstar, you're going to make something wonderful. frankie's the creative type with her finger on the pulse and an eye for style. She rocks a dreamy garter stitch and cute-as-a-button pom poms like nobody's business and she's got just enough detail that no one will believe you knitted her yourself!



Skill level



What you'll need


15mm straight needles
2 x balls colour 1
1 x ball colour 2
Darning needle
Pom Pom maker

Gauge

Garter stitch on 15mm
needles: 10x10cm =
6 stitches x 9 rows

Stitches and techniques you'll master

Casting on
Garter stitch
Changing colour
Casting off

 Garter stitch is one of the easiest and most common stitch patterns, made by knitting every row.

Let's knit up a storm!

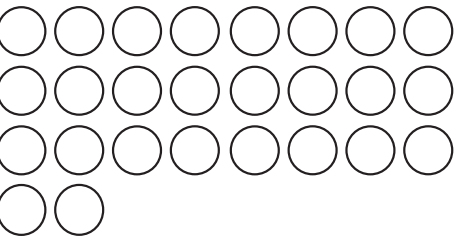
 *Tip: Slipping the first stitch of each row will help to keep the edges of your scarf neat and will help to stop the sides from curling. Simply slip it from your left needle to your right without knitting it, then knit the rest of the stitches. Do this at the start of each row.*

1.


 Using your 15mm straight needles, cast on 16 stitches using the two needle cast on technique with colour 1.

2.

We're going to do 26 rows of garter stitch.
Slip your first stitch then knit to end of row - continue for 26 rows.




3.

 Change your yarn to colour 2. We're going to knit in some alternating coloured bands. When changing colour you won't slip the first stitch on a colour change row. Knit 4 rows in colour 2.





4.

 Change your yarn back to colour 1. We're going to knit another 4 rows in colour 1. Remember you won't slip the first stitch on a colour change row.



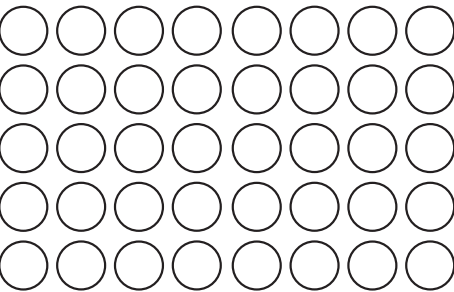
5.

 Change back to colour 2 and we're going to knit in garter stitch to create the body of the scarf. Continue knitting until you have about 20cm left of wool. Next you'll join the second ball of colour 2.


 Try and change wool at the end of the row. If you have extra wool left over that's ok!

6.

Continue knitting with colour 2 for 40 more rows.



7.

 Change to colour 1 and we're going to finish the scarf with the same alternating bands of colour. Knit 4 rows in colour 1.



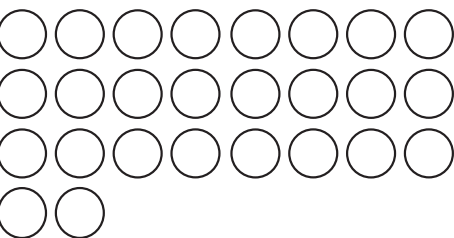
8.

 Change to colour 2 and knit 4 rows in colour 2.



9.

 Change back to colour 1 and we'll finish with 26 rows.



10.

✓ Cast off all stitches and weave in the loose ends with your darning needle.

11.

Only one thing left to do, that's to make your Pom Poms! Using your leftover yarn and your Pom Pom maker you'll create four Pom Poms and attach them to the corners of your scarf. To attach you use your darning needle and the yarn ends you used to tie the Pom Pom together. To see how it's done go to our Knitty Gritty blog at cardigang.com.au
