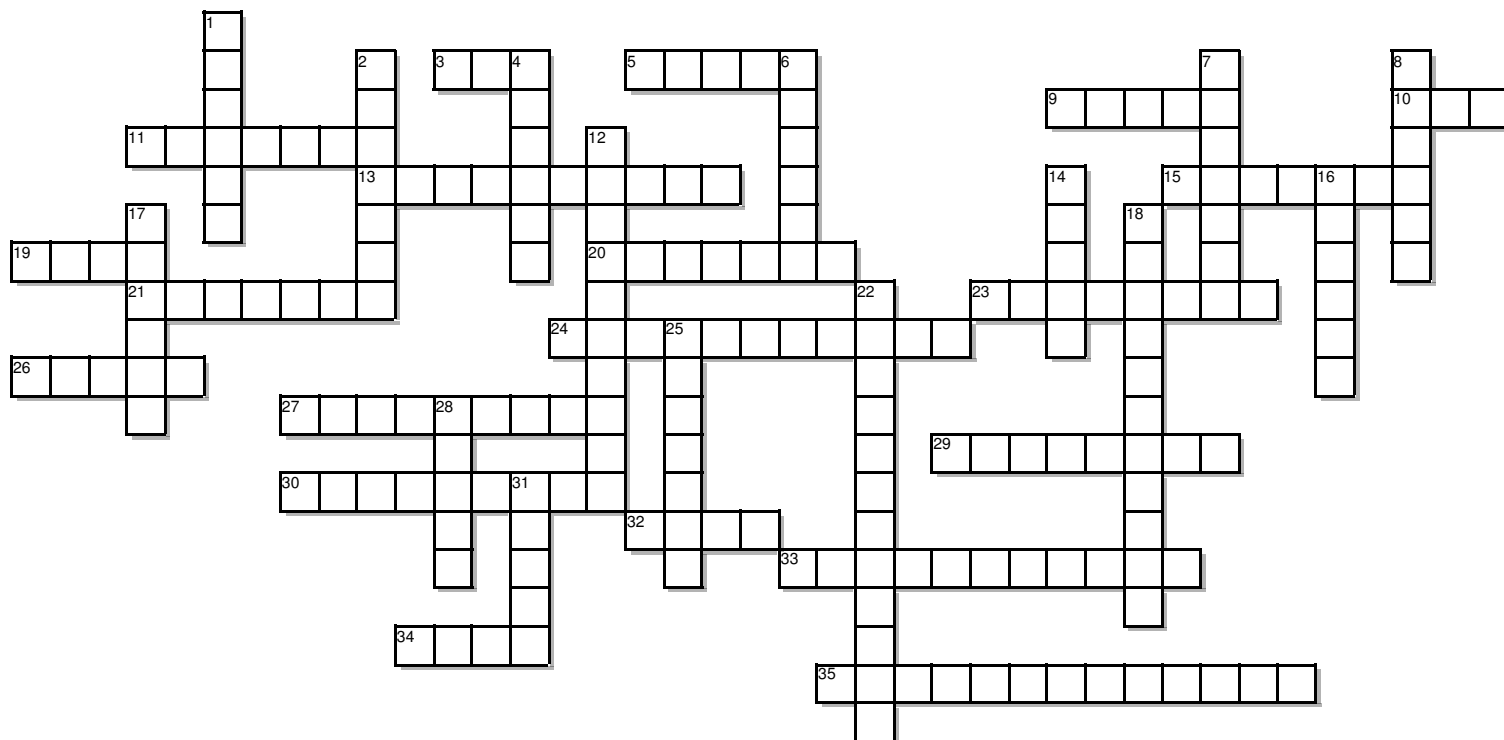


# How well do you remember golf in 2000?

- 5 Surname, Italian player defeated in a play-off by Juli Inkster for the LPGA Championship.
- 9 Nickname of first player in 11 years to win four events in one Australasian Tour season (ending in 2000).
- 10 Initials of prolific American course designer who passed away in June 2000.
- 11 Surname, runner-up 2000 Ericsson Masters and ANZ Tour Championship.
- 13 Host course for Karrie Webb's first Women's Australian Open win.
- 15 Roger who won his first European Tour event in 2000 in his 472nd start.
- 19 Number of strokes Karrie Webb won the Women's US Open by.
- 20 Surname of caddie for Aaron Baddeley when he won the 2000 Australian Open title.
- 21 Surname, highest placed Australian man in last official world ranking of 2000.
- 23 2000 Australian Amateur winner.
- 24 Venue for Tiger Woods' record 15-stroke US Open victory.
- 26 Iron brand being used by Phil Mickelson in 2000.
- 27 This player turned pro on July 16.
- 29 Brand of driver and irons used by Tiger Woods in 2000.
- 30 Surname, highest placed Australian man in first official world ranking of 2000.
- 32 Surname, leading money winner on the LPGA Tour in 2000.
- 33 Tiger Woods' PGA Tour scoring average of 68.11 set a new record that had stood for 55 years held by whom.
- 34 After winning three majors Tiger Woods signed a \$100

- 7 Surname, revolutionary American golf club designer and businessman who died in February 2000.
- 8 Surname, Paraguayan member of International Presidents Cup team.
- 12 Former player turned commentator inducted as a life member of the Australian PGA.
- 14 Popular club manufacturer purchased by Callaway in 2000.
- 16 Highly rated Greg Norman and Bob Harrison-designed course at a private club opened for play.
- 17 Surname, leading Australian on the European Tour money list in 2000.
- 18 Honorary Chairman of the Presidents Cup won by the United States.
- 22 2000 Ford Open (SA) Championship leading amateur who later became an Olympian.
- 25 One of only three hybrid clubs in the market in 2000, produced by Cobra.
- 28 Surname, only player other than Tiger Woods to win a men's major in 2000.
- 31 Bogies made by Tiger Woods in 72 holes during his Open Championship victory at St Andrews.
